
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RESOURCES

The Carroll & Huntington (1988) equation uses 2 measurements to predict a horse's body weight.

Although simple, it's been reported to be an accurate formula (~1% error), and thus can be helpful for the horse owner who does not have access to a livestock scale!

Simply use a soft measuring tape, and measure your horse's heart girth and body length in centimeters, then pop those values into the equation!



For help body condition scoring, we recommend checking out our <u>BCS Resource</u>. We can help talk you through this process as well. Pictures from the side, shoulder angle and behind can be attached, however often underestimates fat deposition, so hands on body condition scoring is ideal.
